

## Seizures

Your pet has been diagnosed with seizures.

A fairly common problem seen in cats & dogs, seizures need to be diagnosed early and treated aggressively to give your pet the best chance at healing and possibly a cure.

Testing must be done to properly determine the cause of and treat your pet's seizures.

Your pet may need some or all of the following testing to determine the cause of your pet's seizures and to determine which natural medications will be most effective. Keep in mind, the sooner the testing is done, the sooner your pet can be treated using only natural therapies without the need of conventional medications. Please note that some treatment will be started today to help your pet on its way to recovery while we are awaiting results of additional testing.

If not already done, your pet will need the following tests to complete his/her seizure evaluation:

Chest/Abdominal Radiographs (X-rays) – These are done to evaluate the or any issues that might be causing your pet's seizures.

Chest/Abdominal ultrasound– This looks for other causes of seizures that might not be seen on conventional radiographs (X-rays).

Blood Profile/ Urinalysis – These tests are done to see if another disease is present which might be causing your pet's seizures, or to see if organ damage has already occurred from your pet's seizures or medication he/she is currently taking.

Fecal Analysis – Fecal Analysis may be done to look for parasites that might be causing your pet's seizures.

MRI/CT: Advanced imaging might been to be done to look for brain lesions as a cause of your pet's seizures.

In order to decrease the progression of your pet's seizure, please schedule your pet's seizure evaluation within the next one to two weeks if not already completed during today's appointment.
